CONDUCT MEETINGS

A Conduct Meeting is a meeting between a resident and a University Administrator that is designed to resolve the resident's role in an incident without the use of a formal judicial body. Conduct Meetings generally take about 30 minutes depending on the incident in question and the extent of the resident's involvement. During the meeting, the resident will be given a copy of the Information Report to review. The resident will then have a chance to respond to the information contained within the Information Report. Following a thorough discuss of all available information, the Administrator will decide if the student is "Responsible" or "Not Responsible" for a violation of University policy and assign appropriate sanctions if applicable.

The Administrators that generally hold conduct meetings are the Assistant Resident Directors, Resident Directors, Apartment Living Coordinators, Apartment Living Assistant Coordinators, Assistant Judicial Affairs Coordinator, Judicial Affairs Coordinator and Assistant Directors.
